2 **Head Teacher Update**

MT shared highlights from the report: KPI

 All progress data must be viewed with caution. These are figures calculated using 4 matrix which has collected data from 100+ schools nationally to try and give an indicative figure.



 Attainment figures look strong with a 24% rise in those achieving 5 GCSE's including English and maths at level 4+ with a 25% rise at level 5. However, this does include the grade inflation that has been applied by the exam boards this year.

It was asked how different are figures from predicted MT advised we were fairly accurate but not known until validated.

- P8 was +0.17 now come down to zero.
- 2 pupils' lack of attendance impacts on figures.
- Middle ability boys will be the focus for the following year.
 However, the Trust Peer Review will be looking at this at our request.

Governors congratulated the MT and staff on good results.

It was raised that there appeared to be some differing information which contradicts the figures for middle ability and P8 MT felt that the share and compare system with 4 Matrix could be comparing with higher achieving schools.

School numbers

- We remain oversubscribed for out boarders and we are now also at capacity with boarders in Year 7
- Appeals have increased with parents wishing to change from boarding to out boarders as their financial situation has changed.

It was asked as the reputation is so good is there a growth case MT advised although we are over subscribed, there are schools in Bridgwater that do have space and this would fall under the Local Authority to fund a growth need.

It was noted, that moving forwards to when the Gravity project lands, there will 12,000 staff with most Bridgwater schools landlocked.

MT advised we normally see demographics about now however before it showed numbers were dropping.

It was noted that changing to just out boarders would be cheaper but it was felt the whole of ethos of school would change.

It was shared that RBSC site has increased due to the new Polden Bower opening and Elmwood and Penrose moving to there from RBSC.

A Governor asked with parents experiencing financial difficulties, is there anything we, or any charities, that could help, especially those students who are in the last year or two of their education MT advised there are charities, but they are already heavily tapped into. The Brymore Old Boys have stepped in very generously but with a 12K debt they are only able to help with so much. We will be



looking into how we can support parents and what other measures can be offered to large debtors.

- Staff changes have been quite significant but it is good to have new staff coming in with fresh ideas.
- We are fully staffed and fortunate to have all subject specialist teachers. However, in the last few days a Houseparent has resigned due to personal reasons.

It was felt the school was very fortunate not to have any vacancies MT shared one of the strongest areas is the quality of TA's at the school.

It was asked when fees were set

MT advised April time.

It was asked what the strategy is to accommodate more parents that are likely to fall into arrears.

MT said the fees are set centrally and went up by 3.5% this year. There is no formal strategy in place as legally you are not allowed to accept pupils back if in debt. However, we are mindful of giving support to our parents and pupils and act accordingly.

Governors acknowledged it was a difficult balance between moral and legal responsibilities.

It was asked are budgets set in a central pot No it is one central pot but boarding is ring fenced Will this position change

No it has never happened and confident it will not change.

Building works

 Library costs have increased by a third and is hold for the time being.

School news

- Brymore open day was fantastic. It was great to celebrate altogether after Covid.
- The 'Back to Brymore' agenda and key focus for last year has largely been a resounding success. It has made a difference to boys' attitudes

It was noted that Covid numbers are increasing and a difficult winter may be ahead.

It was asked when does the results data come out. The validated data is released in Jan

3 Policies

Admissions Policy

MT advised there were no changes to the policy apart from minor information such as dates.

RG proposed acceptance of the policy and AD seconded it.



CP and Safeguarding Policy

MT clarified the policy had already been agreed by the Trust board but two separate statements for boarding and lettings have to be added.

All Governors agreed the policy and statements should be adopted.
